



## Early Years Pupil Premium Statement

The Early Years Pupil Premium (EYPP) is additional funding for early years settings to improve the education they provide for disadvantaged 3 and 4 year olds. £302 per year is awarded per eligible child, per year. Looked after children get a little more. We monitor closely what impact this money has made on the progress made by the children eligible for EYPP.

At Abercromby, we have a small percentage of children eligible for EYPP, although other children are disadvantaged in other ways e.g. through being at beginner stages of learning English. Our aim is to use our EYPP to provide experiences and resources that will benefit our EYPP children but also our other children who need extra support.

### Impact of EYPP on Pupil progress

#### Baseline

3% of children were working towards a good level of development (GLD) and the Average Points Score (APS) was 15.1

In the following key aspects these were the percentages of children at Age Related Expectations CL-Listening and Attention 17%

CL-Understanding 20%

CL-Speaking 17%

Lit-Reading 9%

Lit-writing 6%

#### July 2017

50% of children are now working towards a GLD and APS is 30.6 The 6 children identified as in receipt of EYPP have all made accelerated progress from their baseline.
