



## Early Years Pupil Premium Statement

The Early Years Pupil Premium (EYPP) is additional funding for early years settings to improve the education they provide for disadvantaged 3 and 4 year olds. £302 per year is awarded per eligible child. Looked after children get a little more. We monitor closely what impact this money has made on the progress made by the children eligible for EYPP.

At Abercromby, we have a small percentage of children eligible for EYPP, although other children are disadvantaged in other ways e.g. through being at beginner stages of learning English. Our aim is to use our EYPP to provide experiences and resources that many of our EYPP children wouldn't otherwise access. This will also support other disadvantaged children.

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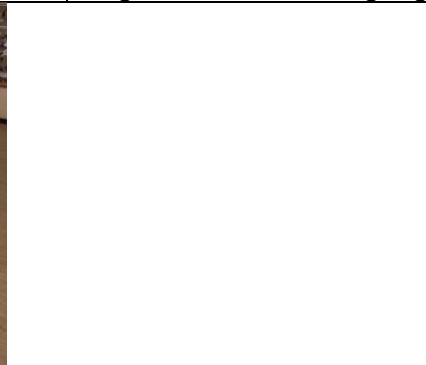
