Please do not bring your child into school if you or your family have symptoms of Covid-19:

- A fever
- A new persistent cough
- A loss or change in sense of smell and/or taste

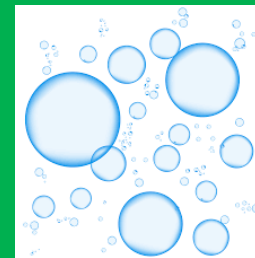
If your child or anyone in your family has symptoms of Coronavirus, please get a test and let us know the result, positive or negative.



Children will wash or sanitise their hands when they come in, before they go home, after the toilet, before eating and every hour throughout the day



We will be doing extra cleaning and wiping down including all the toys, quarantining those that are difficult to clean. We are also using a disinfectant fogger



Children and staff will stay in their own Willow Tree bubble. They will not mix with other children and staff.



Please help us by:

- Keeping a 2m social distance from staff and other children
- One adult only, to drop off at **8.30am** and **pick up at 2.30pm** using the new routes into school via the car park and garden
- Being on time, as outside of these drop off and pick up times the gates are closed
- Following our guidelines If you need to enter school to settle a child
- Letting us know if your child is off and why
- Looking out for our ParentMail emails which will have important information



Please help your child by:

- Talking to them about what will be the same (their favourite things to do inside and outside, playing with other children)
- Talking about what will be different (new way into school, some different children and staff)
- Supporting their education by chatting and sharing books
- Reassuring them that our staff will still be playing with them, helping them to learn and comforting them if they fall over
